

Clean Energy To Build Station In Bridgeview

Clean Energy, a leading provider in natural gas fuel transportation in North America, has selected Bridgeview as the site for one of its newest fueling stations.

The new fueling station, which will be located adjacent to Toyota Park on 71st Street, will have the capabilities of fueling vehicles equipped for liquefied natural gas (LNG) and compressed natural gas (CNG).

With heavy truck traffic already in the immediate area, Clean Energy will be an attractive option for trucks and other vehicles looking to move toward a less expensive and cleaner fuel alternative.

Natural gas vehicles emit up to 30 percent less greenhouse gas than diesel or gasoline vehicles, and natural gas engines are up to 50 percent quieter.

Natural gas fuel often costs at least \$1.50 less than diesel or gasoline, making it a competitive alternative to traditional fossil fuels.

"We're very pleased that Clean Energy chose Bridgeview to expand their business," Mayor Steven Landek said. "With alternative fuels expected to expand their reach in the future, this sends the signal that we'll be ready."

Clean Energy is a California-based company that fuels more than 30,000 vehicles every day at approximately 400-

plus stations across the United States and Canada.

After receiving approval at a recent village board meeting, the company is looking to break ground on the project next spring, with completion set for later in 2014.
